West Coast is where our church is planted. **The Bible Church is not here by chance, you know.** God put us here to be His light, His hands, and to show His hospitality to those who are lost, the last, and the least.

Like what God told His people in Deuteronomy 1:21:

"See, the LORD your God has given you the land. Go up and take possession of it as the LORD, the God of your ancestors, told you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged."
